## Grammar 15c Nominal Sentence (Masculine Gender) Arabic Grammar 1.

Arabic Grammar is divided into two important parts: Sarf and Nahw. Let us take very simplified definitions.

- Sarf (صَرْف): How to make a word from letters (generally 3 letters constitute a word) and
- Nahw (نَحُو): How to join words to make pairs and sentences.

In this lesson, we will learn how to make a simple sentence that starts with a noun. Such a sentence is called **Nominal sentence** (جمله اسمیه). For example:

| كَبِيْرٌ   | ٱلۡبَيۡثُ  |
|--|--|
| is big.  | The house  |
| <ul> <li>This word gives the news that the house is big.</li> <li>It is therefore called خَبَر (news).</li> <li>It does not have U before it.</li> </ul> | <ul> <li>It is the first 'اسم'.</li> <li>Because you know the house that you are talking about, therefore it is الْبَيْث (The house).</li> </ul> |

The Arabic nouns by default have Dhammah (أ) or double Dhammah (أ) on them as if they are always standing and are ready to work. For example, اَللهُ، خَالِدٌ، الْبَيْتُ.

- This status is called زفع status. To show it using TPI, we can use the right-hand finger pointing upwards.
- Both the اسم and the خَبَر in اسم have وفع status.

Learn the translation in the following sentences:

| The believer is pious.          | ٱلْمُؤْمِنُ صَالِحٌ          |
|---------------------------------|------------------------------|
| The believers are pious.        | ٱلۡمُؤۡمِنُوۡنَ صَالِحُونَ   |
| The hypocrite is disobedient.   | ٱلۡمُنَافِقُ فَاسِقُ         |
| The hypocrites are disobedient. | ٱلۡمُنَافِقُوۡنَ فَاسِقُوۡنَ |

| Allah is forgiving.       | اَللَّهُ غَفُوْرٌ           |
|---------------------------|-----------------------------|
| The house is big.         | ٱلۡبَيۡتُ كَبِيرٌ           |
| The Muslim is truthful.   | ٱلْمُسْلِمُ صَادِقٌ         |
| The Muslims are truthful. | ٱلۡمُسۡلِمُوۡنَ صَادِقُوۡنَ |

Learn to make the plural in the following sentences:

| ٱلْمُسْلِمُونَ صَادِقُونَ  | اَلْمُسْلِمُ صَادِقٌ  |
|----------------------------|-----------------------|
| ٱلْمُؤُمِنُونَ صَالِحُونَ  | اَلْمُؤْمِنُ صَالِحٌ  |
| ٱلۡمُنَافِقُونَ فَاسِقُونَ | اَلْمُنَافِقُ فَاسِقُ |

With proper names, we don't need  $\mathcal{U}$  because the name itself shows that we are talking of a specific person. For example:

| Muhammad مليالله is a Messenger. | مُحَمَّدٌ رَسُولُ |
|----------------------------------|-------------------|
| Hood AS is a Prophet.            | هُوَدٌ نَبِيٌّ    |
| Zaid is small.                   | زَيْدٌ صَغِيْرٌ   |
| Sa'd is big.                     | سَعْدٌ كَبِيْرُ   |
