
Double Fathah is Tanween

- By adding another Fathah, actually we added a ن there!
- Noon-izing or Noon-ation is called "Tanween" in Arabic.
- These occur only on the last letter of a word.








Just add extra Fathah in the word itself. No need of space! You can have كتابٌ or كتابٌ too. There are other uses of Tanween too!




