# Why? **The Connecting Hamzah** همزة الوصل

It connects and then drops!

وَاللَّهُ = وَ + اللَّهُ

عَبْدُ اللَّهِ = عَبْدُ + اللَّهُ

وَالشَّمْسُ = وَ + الشَّمْسُ

وَالْقَمَرُ = وَ + الْقَمَرُ

You need a letter with a Harakah to connect!

# **The Tiny Noon (النون القطني)**

- **Tanween letter + the Connecting Hamzah  
➔ Tanween is replaced by a tiny Noon.**
- **The Tiny Noon have always Kasra.**

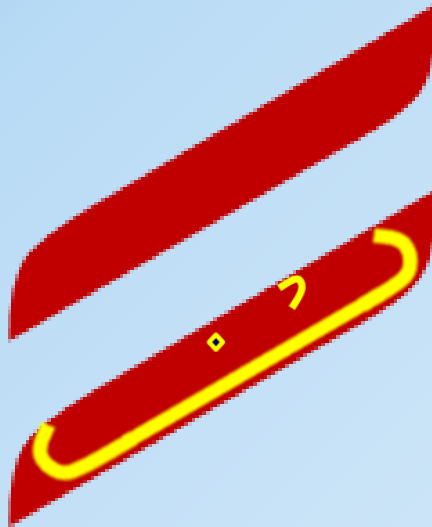
